

Experience Nungarin

Nungarin is a small wheatbelt town (the population of the entire shire is less than 300), but what we lack in size we make up for in just about everything else. With limited shopping you will find ample free parking, and our toilets are always open!

We have lots of interesting heritage buildings, including the earliest homestead in the district, the largest timber ex-army storage shed in the southern hemisphere, the quaintest road board office - hardly bigger than the average bathroom - but considered so important and desirable that at one time it was defended at gun point!

Our history is colourful, and often hilarious. If you are interested in heritage there are several scripted trails within Nungarin, with brochures available for a walk around the town, a wander through the cemetery, and a self drive trail to Danberrin.

The Nungarin Heritage Machinery and Army Museum is housed in an original massive army vehicle workshop constructed during WWII. The museum contains an impressive collection of equipment and machinery including a 10th Light Horse display and a rare Dingo scout car. The museum is open 9.00 am to 12.00 noon and 2.00 to 5.00 pm each day. Guided tours on Sunday, or for large groups can be organised by appointment.
